Farmington Hills Police Officers Released from Hospital Following April 1 House Fire Rescues

Officers expressed appreciation for community support

FARMINGTON HILLS, Mich. (April 2, 2025) - The Farmington Hills Police Department is glad to announce that the medical conditions of the officers involved in the house fire rescues on April 1 have greatly improved.

Throughout the night and early morning, the three officers who were on ventilators continued to show signs of improvement. While being monitored closely by medical staff this morning, each was removed from their ventilators. The officers continued to be evaluated by their physicians and have currently all been released from the hospital. The officers have returned home, where they will continue their recovery until they are cleared to return to duty.

"The officers are in good spirits and are truly grateful for the outpouring of support that they and their families have received while they have been hospitalized," said Farmington Hills Police Chief John Piggott. "Additionally, the officers and I are exceptionally grateful to the medical staffs at Corewell Health Farmington Hills Hospital and DMC Detroit Receiving Hospital Burn Unit for their outstanding care and support."
