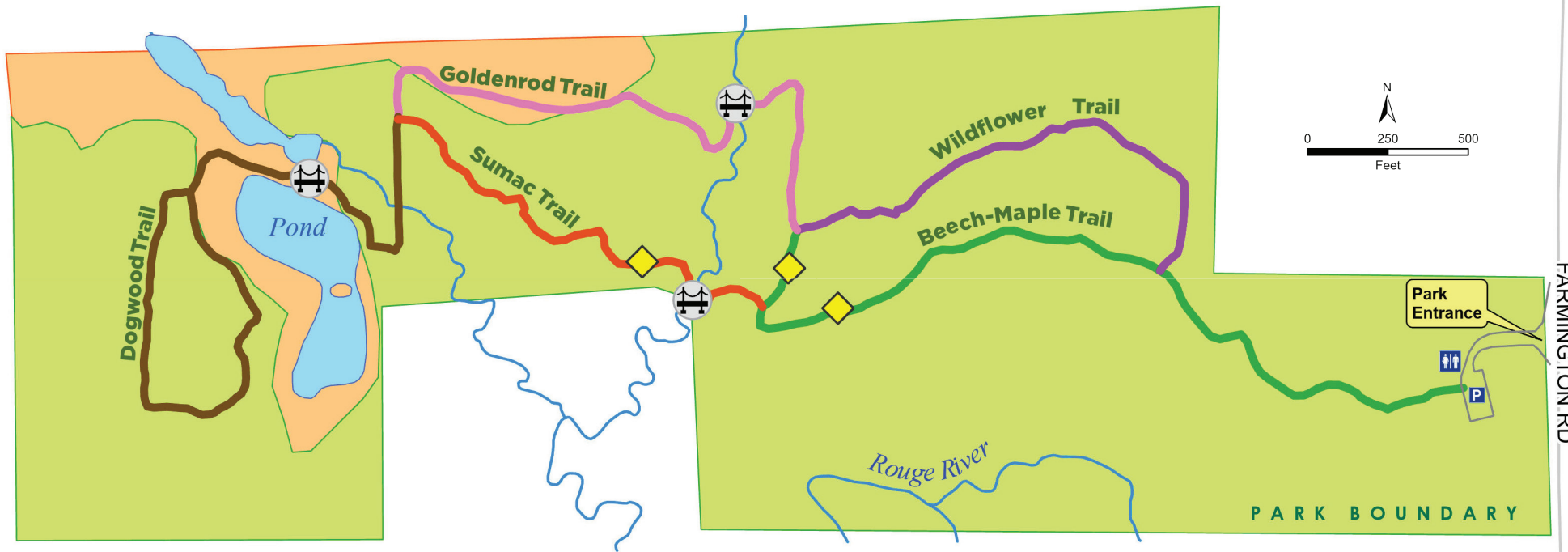

Woodland Hills is a sanctuary for native plants and animals to thrive within their natural habitat. The park is managed primarily for the protection of these species and features. The rustic trails in this park preserve the uniqueness of the area.



FLORA + FAUNA

Black Raspberries, Serviceberries, and Crabapples	Beech, Maple, Black Cherry, and Oak Trees	Waterfowl like ducks and amphibians shelter in the pond
Spring and Fall Warblers in May and September	Nesting for Owls and Hawks	Egrets, Blue and Green Herons hunt in the pond
