Mayor Pro Tem Jackie Boleware Appointed to Lead National League of Cities' First Tier Suburbs Council

FARMINGTON HILLS, Mich. (Dec. 15, 2025) — Jackie Boleware, Mayor Pro Tem of Farmington Hills, has been appointed Vice Chair of the <u>National League of Cities</u> (NLC) 2026 <u>First Tier Suburbs Council</u>. Mayor Pro Tem Boleware was elected to a one-year term to develop and guide programs among local elected officials from similar communities. The appointment was announced by NLC President Kevin Kramer, Councilmember of Louisville, Kentucky.
